“Moulton’s golfers wrap up an impressive season”

The final round of the British Schools/Colleges Golf Tour was hosted by Loughborough College. Moulton A came second in the Gross competition meaning they took the title overall, with Moulton B coming in fourth. Loughborough won the Nett competition for the third consecutive round but were beaten to the overall title by Burton College, who never finished outside the top two, with Moulton A and B finishing in third and fourth places respectively.

Lauren Taylor won the individual competition for the third time with a score of 72 and finished second in the overall Order of Merit with 103.5 points behind Alex Hull, the winner from Loughborough College, with 110. Lauren would surely have won the overall title if it was not for an international commitment causing her to miss round 2. She was joined in the top ten by Michael Campbell (3rd), Damien Woodward (4th), Gavin Cope (8th) and Jack Hall (10th).

This means that Moulton have made a real impact in only their second season as a golfing college as these successes complement the recent victory in the Intercollegiate Tour by Moulton A in the Nett competition where they again finished with five players in the top ten. This time Lauren Taylor won the Order of Merit (despite missing a round) with Michael Campbell again finishing 3rd, Damian Woodward 5th, Gavin Cope 6th and Dan Ashcroft 8th.

Rosslyn Park National School 7s Tournament

After weeks of preparation on the training pitch, and entry into a couple of warm up 7s tournaments, the Moulton girls travelled to Rosslyn Park in a buoyant mood. Keen to make up for the disappointment at Cambridge, where they went out in the semis, the girls were fully tuned in to what they were about to face at the world's largest organised rugby tournament. The tournament consisted of a group stage and a knockout stage. In order to progress to the knockout stage it was essential for the girls to win the group which meant that there were three tough games ahead on day 1.

Day 1- Group Stages

Moulton College 62 -0 Davenant Foundation Grammar School

First up for Moulton was Davenant Foundation Grammar school. The girls were well prepared and switched on from the warm up. From the start the girls tore into the Davenant side, Lucie Wood and Leanne Riley forcing turnovers with some thumping tackles and with the Moulton girls scoring at ease, brushing aside would be tacklers. Unfortunately for Davenant the impact of the subs meant that the pressure just increased, Vicki Brood performing well and taking some well deserved tries.

Moulton College 41-12 The Judd School

Second up for Moulton was The Judd School. The girls looked a fairly physical team and surprised Moulton straight away with a score under the posts, a result of poor tackling technique from the Moulton girls. This shocked the team into action; however, Moulton struggled to retain possession and kept taking the ball into contact far too often without support. It was Leanne Riley who managed to get the ball on the wing and outpace the defence to score under the posts, Lauren Cattell converting to make the half time score 7-7. With some tactics discussed at half time, the Moulton girls came out in the second half firing, Leanne Riley having a storming game and scoring three further tries. The much better fitness and handling skill of the Moulton girls allowed them to pull away, Carys Williams scoring with a trademark half way run in. However, The Judd pulled one back as a result of some poor tackling out wide. Again Vicki Brood came on and scored a fantastic solo effort showing a great turn of pace. Final score 41-12 in a well contested game.

Moulton College 33-0 Ysgol Gyfun Bro Myrddin

With two wins under their belt Moulton moved into their last game against Welsh side Ysgol Gyfun Bro Myrddin. With a slow start again the score remained at 7-0 to Moulton College at half time, courtesy of a Leanne Riley try and Cattell conversion. The second half showed some good 7s being played by all players but particularly by Carys Williams, Lucie Wood, Harriet Kerswell and Zoe Burrows, who scored her first two tries for the

college and converted one of them. The result meant that Moulton won the group and were through to the knockout stages of the competition, held at the Rosslyn Park Rugby ground on the 1st team pitch.

Day 2 - Knockout Stages

Quarter Finals

Moulton College 29 – 0 Neath Port Talbot College

Moulton travelled back down to Rosslyn Park for the knockout stages of the National schools 7s competition fully prepared, knowing they were going to be facing tough competitors from across the border in Neath Port Talbot College. They were yet to concede a point in the competition, having scored more than 41 points in each game played during the group stages.

Moulton had prepared meticulously for this game leaving no stone unturned. The warm up was intense, and the girls were clearly fired up and ready for the tough match ahead. Moulton exploded into Neath from the start, Lucie Wood leading the charge with a strong ball carry. Good ball retention skills and play by all 7 on the field led to Lauren Cattell setting up Leanne Riley for an early run in under the posts.

Moulton were playing some top 7s, a big improvement from the day before, and were smashing Neath back in defence whenever they got the ball. Moulton scored five tries overall, Leanne Riley having a stormer yet again with 3 of them. All players played exceptionally well against a very good Neath side; however the passion and the class of the Moulton girls shone through and they thoroughly deserved their 29-0 victory.

Semi – Finals

Moulton College 48- 0 Truro College

After getting through the first game, it was Truro College, last season's runners up in the competition, in the semi finals. The Moulton girls were ready for this game, fully focused on the task at hand and ready to put their bodies on the line.

Moulton lost the toss, kicked to Truro and went flying into the tackles and contact area. The girls were playing some outstanding 7s, moving the ball wide, hitting some great angles and switching the direction of attack. It wasn't long before the tries began to flow again, Leanne Riley scoring another try. Some great scores, including a 55m break and try from prop Amy Needham, and some fantastic 7s throughout the game ensued. The Moulton girls were outstanding and punished Truro with some excellent skill and quick 7s. Lauren Cattell orchestrated well at fly half, looking a class above, and deserved a trade mark dummy and score under the posts. Moulton were now through to the final against well known arch rivals Hartpury College.

Final

Moulton College 12-24 Hartpury College

For some of the Moulton players this would be the last time they were going to play 7s for the college. The team had slowly developed over the two days and were just getting better and better, with by far the best 7s game of the girls tournament played by Moulton in the semi finals. If Moulton were to beat Hartpury today it was going to take a great effort.

Moulton started badly, conceding an easy score straight away. Some good tackles were being put in by Moulton but Hartpury were just able to offload the ball out of the tackle from their very physical big players. Some small errors, probably due to nerves, were starting to creep into Moulton's game and the half time score was 0-24 to Hartpury.

With a couple of changes made at half time and all the subs on after about a minute of the second half, Moulton managed to gain the upper hand, instantly scoring a try converted by Cattell. From the restart Moulton were chasing well; good pressure from Vicki Brood and Kelly Robertson allowed for a turnover and Moulton started to play the 7s we had seen them play earlier in the day. Good hands from all the backs and a strong run allowed Carys Williams to pull another try back. A comeback looked on the cards! Moulton were pinning Hartpury back in their 22 and Hartpury resorted to kicking possession away. However, quick thinking from winger Vicki Brood allowed a quick lineout to be taken, with Kelly Robertson almost getting away out wide after a long pass from Lauren Cattell. Moulton continued to pressure Hartpury and looked the better side. A huge tackle by Kelly Robertson on England U20s international Alex Matthews left Alex concussed and the game halted for a while. This stopped the momentum and Hartpury were able to hold on for victory to win the National 7s.
