Finally, in the last five minutes of the first half, Andy Felton was rewarded when a fine Charlie Astley pass found him and, from the edge of the box, he gave the keeper no chance as he fired a shot into the top right-hand corner.

The second half proved to be very one sided. Although Easton were very game Moulton proved too strong; another fine goal from Andy Felton made it 2-0 and this was quickly followed by a great third goal as Job Nyakuya set Andy Felton away down the left and his deep cross was met by Mapeo Mendes who gave the goalkeeper no chance as he drilled home from ten yards.

This was a very good performance from Moulton as the back five worked hard to keep a clean sheet, the midfield four were creative and protected the defence and the front two were able to take their chances, so all-round it was a very convincing 3-0 win.

Moulton looked like they were on top of the game but then another mistake was made when, instead of playing simply, Moulton gave the ball away. Even though this had happened Moulton's back four should have defended better, nullifying the attack, but CV Reds' Mohamed Ossman got behind the back four and scored the third goal. Moulton ploughed forward trying to get back into the game which left them vulnerable at the back and it was the substitute for the home side, Joe Alvarez, who crossed the ball to Ade Adeniyi who then muscled his way past Moulton's Sol Boyer to extend the CV Reds lead further to 4-1.

The away side had enough chances to get something out of this match but the name of the game is putting the ball into the back of the net and the home side were far more adept at this.
