The qualification is offered on three pathways: Construction Management, Civil Engineering and Building Services Engineering and covers a wide range of professional job roles.

The Higher Apprenticeship in Construction is extremely dynamic in nature and will allow you to clearly evidence modern methods of design, construction and maintenance of the built environment in action. You will have the opportunity to apply critical reasoning and analysis

techniques to solve built environment and engineering problems. Apprenticeship requirements

To start a Higher Apprenticeship you need to be 18 years or older and have prior achievement of a Level 3 qualification. Experienced candidates can be offered places subject to successful assessment of their prior learning and/or experience.

Getting started on an Apprenticeship

At the outset of the apprenticeship, we work with you and your employer to design an apprenticeship and training package that will best suit your role. These apprenticeships usually take 36 months to complete but again, we'll discuss this with you at the start.

Apprentices need to be employed in a relevant role for at least 30 hours a week and be at least 16 years old.
