Getting ready for your enrolment

Your enrolment is a key part of joining Moulton and it starts now. By completing these steps over the next few months, you'll have everything ready for when you get here.

Telephone call to confirm your place

A member of our Student Services team will call you by phone to check through your personal information data, making sure that our records are complete and up-to-date. These calls will take place during July and August.

You can find the date and approximate time that your call will take place in the letter in your Joining Pack.

Please make sure that you take this call as it is an important part of the joining process. This call should take approximately ten minutes.

Course enrolment

Between 18 August 2025 and 29 August 2025 you will need to come into College to complete your enrolment. Different courses will be enrolled on different dates and times, so it is important that you attend College on your specified time.

You can find the date and time that you need to come to College to enrol in the letter in your joining pack.

If you can't make this date contact student services who will do their best to rearrange your appointment.

Moving into our residences?

If you are going to be staying in one of our residential blocks during your course your enrolment will take place on your moving in date which will be advised by our Residential Team.

Things to do before your enrolment:

Before you arrive for your enrolment, there are some important things you need to do. This will help us make your enrolment day as smooth as possible. We've included your next steps below, to guide you through the process.

Fill in your forms

1. Reserve your place by completing the acceptance form.
2. Complete the transport application form
3. Complete the financial support form
4. Complete the medical questionnaire via the QR code in your offer pack
5. Complete the Residential Form if required.
6. Apply for a parking permit if you are planning to bring your own car onto campus.

There may be some fees to pay before you start, including transport fees. Don't forget, we offer bursaries for students to help with these costs.

Upload your GCSE results

If you are taking your GCSEs at school this summer we need you to upload your GCSE results to our portal on Thursday 21 August 2025. Full details on how to do this are included in your enrolment letter.

What to bring to enrolment

There are a few things that you need to bring to your enrolment day. Please make sure you have the following items.

Proof of your exam results

Bring a copy of your results transcript or certificates. It's important you do this, even if your results have been sent to us previously. Please note, you won't be able to enrol you unless you have a copy of your qualifications with you.

Proof of ID

Passport or driving license (if you don't have these, you can bring your birth certificate).

Learning Support and additional needs

Please make sure, if you haven't already, that you provide us with copies of any Educational, Health and Care Plans, Educational Psychologist Reports or individual support plans.

Our support team are here to support you during your time at Moulton. Visit our website to see what types of support is available to you.

Did you have any additional exam arrangements at school?

When you've taken exams at school, you may have been granted extra time, a reader, scribe or other additional exam help. If you want to be assessed for extra help in exams while you're here too, it's important that you visit the Learning Support Desk during enrolment and let our team know. You'll need to bring your Form 8 (J8), signed and dated.

Please note, if you don't bring your Form 8 we won't be able to highlight your exam needs as a priority and this may delay your application for any special arrangements.

Your Enrolment FAQs

We've answered some of your most frequently asked questions below, to help you feel prepared for your enrolment.

When do I enrol?

Between Tuesday 19 August and Friday 29 August 2025, you will need to come to the College to complete your enrolment. Different courses will be enrolled on different dates and times, so it is important that you attend College on your specified date.

You can find your date and time that you need to come to College to enrol in the letter in your joining pack and also in your enrolment timetable on pages 9, 10 and 11.

Where will my enrolment take place?

Enrolment for all of our courses will be taking place at our Moulton campus. If you planning to study a course at our Higham Ferrers campus you still need to travel to Moulton to complete your enrolment.

At your allotted day and time please go to Gate 1, Pitsford Road, Moulton, Northamptonshire, NN3 7SY. Your enrolment will take place in our Learning Hub.

When you arrive at campus there will be staff and signage directing you to where you need to go.

What happens at enrolment?

You will meet your Course Tutor, who will check your qualification results to ensure you have achieved the grades needed to get on your course. Please make sure you bring your qualification results slip or certificates with you.

One of our enrolment team will then check your ID and ensure the details we have for you, to set up your student record, are correct. You will then be asked to sign your Learning Agreement, before we take your photo for your student ID badge.

You will also have an opportunity to meet our Transport, Learning Support and Careers Teams.

There will be, for some curriculum areas, an opportunity to view / try on required course clothing and equipment.

How do I get to my enrolment?

You'll need to make your own way to your enrolment.

Do my parents/guardians need to come to my enrolment?

You are welcome to bring someone with you to enrolment, especially if payment is still outstanding for transport, etc.

What if I can't make my enrolment date?

It is important that you attend your initial enrolment appointment as this will be the date to meet your fellow students and course manager, however, if you cannot make it, please contact our Student Services Team on 01604 491131 or email student.services@moulton.ac.uk and we will arrange another appointment for you.

What if I do not get the GCSE / exam results I need or achieve better than expected?

Don't worry if you don't get the results you hoped for, or achieve better grades than expected, most of our offers are based on predicted grades, but we can look at your options when you meet your Course Manager during enrolment. . Please attend the start date and time as notified in your letter.

What if I want to study a different course or change my application?

We can sometimes accept requests to transfer you to a different course, subject to space still being available.

Will I get my timetable at enrolment?

You will be given your start date at enrolment, and your timetable will follow in the first week of term.

Will I have tuition fees?

If you are between 16 and 18, you will not have course tuition fees. If you are 19 or above on 31 August 2025, you must pay tuition fees. Depending on your circumstances, age and the course you are studying, you may be eligible for funding. Please contact Student Services for more information.

Getting to College

We run bus services across Northamptonshire and neighboring counties. If you want to travel on Moulton transport, it's important that you apply as soon as possible before your enrolment, and pay your first term or set up a payment plan. This will ensure you have a space in September 2025.

The transport application form will have been sent to you with your offer pack, if you no longer have this or require another, please contact **transport@moulton.ac.uk** who will ensure a form is sent to you.



Please note, you'll need to travel to your enrolment yourself.

At your enrolment, if you've applied for transport, paid your first term or set up your payment plan, you will be given a temporary transport pass along with your bus timetable and we will show you where to get the bus home. We will give you your permanent pass on your first day at the college along with your student ID card.
