## What you'll learn

Gain an insight into countryside industry practice, develop your understanding of ecology, conservation and deer management and learn more about a range of plants, trees and environments. Focus on the progression of British habitats, and the importance of good practice in soil cultivation, affecting wildlife and plants. Develop your tractor driving skills and undertake commercial work experience.

## A typical week

This is a full time course taking place on three to four days per week from 9am - 4:30pm. There will be a mix of practical and theoretical work which are split into 1 hour - 2 hour lessons.

## How will I be assessed?

- Externally assessed Exams
- Assignments

## Where can it lead to?

A Level 2 Diploma will give you the chance to progress to a Level 3 course or an apprenticeship. Alternatively, you may go on to be an assistant park ranger, groundsman, estate worker or assistant park manager.

Four GCSEs at grade 2-3 (D-E) or above or a Level 1 Diploma in a related subject.
